

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By The Numbers


- BC covers 944,735 km² of land and water
- Population of 4.5 million people
- Approximate Aboriginal population of 250,000 people
- 203 distinct BC First Nations
- 7 Health Authorities (Provincial and Regional)
- 8 months old - age of First Nations Health Authority

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Panorama


- The BC provincial Panorama project commenced in 2007 as part of a Pan-Canadian Public Health Renewal Initiative in response to the significant human and economic loss due to the 2003 SARS outbreak (44 lost lives and an estimated \$1B cost to Ontario).



- Canada's fragmented multi-jurisdictional system needed to strengthen its public health infrastructure in order to be ready for the next major outbreak.

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Objectives

- Panorama deployment into First Nations Health Centres
- Enable First Nations Data Stewardship
- Contribute to First Nations eHealth capacity development



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Gaps and Dependencies to Overcome

- Network connectivity
- User authentication, enrolment and account management
- Compliance with privacy and security requirements
- Information Sharing Agreement and Data Governance Model
- User training and support model
- Workflow and standards integration

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Projected Successes

Forecasted Statistics (Q3 2014)

Approximately 7 additional First Nations Health Service Organizations will go live on Panorama:

- Cowichan Tribes, Inter Tribal Health Authority, Sto:lo Nation Health, Okanagan Indian Band Health, Scw'Exmx Community Health, Pauquachin First Nation, Ktunaxa Nation Health
- Providing public health services to 31 more First Nations
- An additional ~10,000 First Nations clients served

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Current Status of Deployment

Current Statistics (as of June 2014)

7 First Nations Health Service Organizations using provincial instance of Panorama to support clinical service delivery (the first in Canada!):

- Tla'Amin Health, Three Corners Health Services Society, Kwakiutl District Council Health, Seabird Island Health, Westbank First Nation Health, Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council, Sauteau First Nation Health
- Providing public health services to 38 First Nations
- First Nations population served, ~16,700 clients
